November 23/24, 2013: Solemnity of Christ the King

Solemnity of Christ the King: 34 Sunday OT Year C 2 Sam 5:1-3; Ps 122; Col 1:12-20; Luke 23:35-43

The leaders and some Roman soldiers ridiculed Jesus on the cross. These religious and imperial authorities delighted in the irony of seeing Jesus, the man who had defied their power, nailed down to a cross and hanged like a petty criminal. Jesus had refused to back down from his belief in the Good News of God's Kingdom—a belief that threatened the powers that be. Many leaders had tried to trap Jesus into blaspheming and into speaking treasonously against the emperor. They questioned him about paying taxes to the Romans, about his authority to teach, and his identity as a child of God. Each time, Jesus subverted the leaders' plotting; his answers revealed their narrow-mindedness and made a mockery of their authority. By executing Jesus, the rulers were reminding everyone who was in charge of their lives. "And the people stood by, watching..."

So often in our own lives we feel swept along by forces outside our control. We pay taxes, knowing that some of our money ends up squandered by corruption. We participate in an economy that continues to benefit the richest among us, while leaving our poorer neighbours with less. Brands use complex strategies to compete not only for our precious time and attention, but for our very souls. It can feel like we're being stretched out and nailed down too—helpless before the "thrones or dominions or rulers or powers." It can feel like all we can do is stand by and watch.

Jesus doesn't stand by. Instead, he stands up to death and to the powers in this world. He did this to save our souls from being conquered by the forces in the world we can't control. Christ is the King of all things in creation. He is a King who is of our very "bone and flesh"; a ruler who understands what it is to be conquered and weak. He stands up to those in charge without becoming corrupted by using power himself. By shunning glory for himself, he shows just how demented the forces of this world are. These powers rely on our devotion for their strength. Jesus strips these forces of their control by refusing to worship them. Instead, he enters fully into the weakness that we feel in our own lives and claims us as God's own. His cross is our passport—the mark of our citizenship in heaven. No power on earth can revoke our membership in Christ. Through him, we too can stand before the forces of this world and refuse to worship their false strength. ~Tom Bailey Robertson, Pastoral Associate
