

November 26/27, 2016: 1st Sunday of Advent

First Sunday of Advent: Isaiah 2:1-5; Romans 13:11-14; Matthew 24:37-44

Jesus compares the coming of the Son of Man to the great flood that Noah faced: both were unexpected. When we imagine the ark from the story, we might envision a massive wooden boat with thick and sturdy timbers supporting level after level of stables and cages for all the animals. However, there's a line in the book of Wisdom that paints us a different picture, "When the earth was flooded because of him [Cain, the unrighteous man], wisdom again saved it, steering the righteous man by a paltry piece of wood" (Wisdom 10:4). Before the magnificent glory of God, the ark is a measly chunk of wood. Yet this flimsy ark was enough to see Noah and his family through the great flood. For us, the ark of our salvation is the wood of the Cross—a mere tree through which God inaugurates the Kingdom of Heaven here on earth. Just as the flood was unexpected, and the ark was an unlikely means to persevere the storm, God's reign shows up in unpredictable ways.

It might seem unfair then, that Jesus announces we must be prepared for this unexpected arrival. How can we prepare for that which is unknown? The good news is that because the Kingdom of God shows up unexpectedly, we can face all the unknowns in our life with hope. Every question yet to be answered in our lives remains charged with the possibility of God showing up. During Advent, we wait in hopeful expectation that God will break into our lives once more. So, all of our waiting carries that same possibility. Whether we wait for test results from the doctor, news about our scholarship application, or to hear from a long lost friend, we can wait with the hope that God will be there in whatever outcome we face.

When the results don't go our way, it might seem like the flood waters are rising and we can feel overwhelmed. In those moments we might wish for some big and dramatic sign that God has our back—a massive ark to climb aboard and whisk us away from this mess. Yet God's ways are unpredictable. That which seems fragile and tenuous to us might very well be God's means of directing our rescue. Every day, the light gets a little brighter. What seemed like a paltry piece of wood from afar turns out to be the cross on which hangs the hope of the worldour hope. We can rush to face the unknown with the confidence and faith that God is coming to meet us.
