


# Solemn Vespers for the Completion of the Centennial Year:

## November 28/29, 2015: First Sunday of Advent

First Week of Advent: Jeremiah 33:14-16; 1 Thessalonians 3:12-4:2; Luke 21:25-28, 34-36

One of the many parental aids to roll out over the years is the noise machine—a little electronic box that emits background sounds like chirping crickets, falling rain, or a beating heart. It helps newborns sleep by recreating the similar kinds of white noise they grew accustomed to hearing in the womb. So even out on the bald prairie, our household can fall asleep to the gentle roar of a simulated ocean. Though soothing, I do miss the old nighttime soundtrack: the constant drone of trucks on the Perimeter, the low whining of a passing bus, geese honking overhead, a distant train blowing its horn, and my all-time winter favourite, the breathy whisper of the furnace kicking on. We all have comfort sounds that recreate those cozy feelings of home, security, and rest.

Advent, with its familiar tones and traditions, has the potential of being the seasonal equivalent of elevator music that lulls us into carrying on with business as usual. However, the Gospel seems to suggest a more frantic holiday backdrop than the usual homespun wreaths, twinkling lights, and sprinkling of snow. Instead, these are words we hear to ease us into the new liturgical year; distress, confused, fear, foreboding, shaken, and worries. Uh. I thought we were getting ready of the coming of the Prince of Peace, not some shady cult leader or paranoid insurance salesman. It's no wonder many of us are happy to focus on the happy rituals and settle in for a sleepy trip to January.

Life rarely serves up that kind of break. We know all too well that lighting the Advent wreath won't fix the bad news in our lives or from around the world. There will still be people hurting each other, refugees in need of shelter, hot water tanks to replace, and unexpected hospital visits. Life happens, even during the so-called happiest time of year. Do God's promises hold up, even during the turmoil? If anything, it's during the worst times in our lives when God sends a word of good news. People who are hungry for hope are the ones who listen urgently for a sign that things are going to be okay. God bolsters our faith, so we have the strength to listen at the door for the Lord's footsteps climbing our steps. It's not easy to listen amidst all the noise. It's tempting to give up trying to sort through the static for a signal from God. Yet it's in those moments when we've seemingly lost touch with God that Christ tells us to be on guard, because it's when our world is most shaken up that we can expect to get the call. We'll recognize the voice because the one who calls is the same one who gave us the strength to endure the wait.
