November 2/3, 2013: 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time

31st Sunday in Ordinary Time: *Wisdom 11:22-12:2/Psalm 145:1-2, 8-9, 10-11, 13, 14/2 Thessalonians 1:11-2:2/Luke 19:1-10* Zacchaeus was used to being ignored. People pretended not to notice him when he walked through the marketplace. Making eye contact with a tax collector is an invitation to have your pocket picked. "How's business?" he'd ask nonchalantly—he repaid the indifference of others by carrying himself with a cool demeanor. "I noticed you've moved to a bigger stall—expanding operations, huh?" The poor merchant, farmer, or fisherman knew where this was going, but would play along politely anyway, hoping to avoid the point when the conversation would turn to their tax obligation. Their faces wore a vacant look as he spoke to them: their eyes would shift around as if searching for an escape; their temples pulsed in time with their pounding hearts; their hands would fidget as though they were adding up how they would feed their families on even slimmer margins. All of this wore on Zacchaeus so that he had stopped longing for people to notice him.

One day, word came that Jesus was coming through town. The townsfolk were curious and excited to see the man with snappy answers to those longwinded religious leaders; a man who could purportedly heal the sick and cast out demons. Zacchaeus tried to line up beside the road, but his neighbours coolly boxed him out. All he could see was their backs. Having people ignore him was one thing, but this felt like he was being cast aside like a piece of trash; he felt 10 inches tall.

Zacchaeus didn't protest or complain, he didn't even think. His reaction was spontaneous and instinctive: in a daze, he tore away from the crowd and clambered up the nearest tree. He didn't realize just how silly he was being until he noticed that the din from the crowd had not only subsided—they were palpably silent and staring at him. He locked eyes with a man standing at the bottom of his tree. This man wasn't glaring at him like the others; his gaze was filled with something else, something Zacchaeus hadn't felt for a long time. Was it respect? No, this look was more like de-light, maybe even love. "Zacchaeus," the man called out, "hurry and come down, for I must stay at your house today." Jesus knew him by name. Jesus looked at him when others turned their backs on him. Jesus didn't just want to come over—he insisted on it, as if Zacchaeus had a busy social calendar that would interfere with a visit. Zacchaeus stood there flabbergasted, but what came out of his own mouth next shocked him, and everyone else, even more. What? Half his possessions? Repay his offenses four times over? This wasn't just a change of heart for Zacchaeus, this was him coming back to life. Zacchaeus was lost, but Jesus found him. ~*Tom Bailey-Robertson, Pastoral Associate*
