November 5/6, 2016: 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time: 2 Maccabees 7:1-2, 7, 9-14; 2 Thessalonians 2:16-3:5; Luke 20:27-38

In a skeptical world like ours, faith can come across as naïve. This present Information Age values certainty and evidence, while faith, by definition, can only abide in absence of these. If something could be proven by evidence, then it wouldn't take faith to believe it. For this reason, faith is sometimes chided as being the realm of the intellectually lazy. Rather than use their faculties of reason, the faithful are content to either submit to religious authority, or to remain wilfully ignorant of enlightenment by science—at least, those are the charges that skeptics level against faith. As products of this present age, each of us experience moments when that voice of skepticism rings inside our own minds. Yet, God continues to raise us from the dullness of a world void of meaning into God's own creative presence.

For the seven brothers and their mother in today's first reading, they chose to live as though the Word of God passed down to them through their ancestors were true. To the Greek king Antiochus, this kind of loyalty was both abhorrent and tantalizing. If he could entice them to deny their faith, he would prove to be more powerful, more worthy of worship than the God of the Israelites. So, he submitted the family to horrific torture. One by one, they died rather than submit to his authority or to his offers of wealth and power. God gave them a faith so strong, it surpassed even death itself. The resilience of their faith astonished Antiochus and also frustrated him terribly—here was a source of power that the ruler had no control over.

The Sadducees were not cruel like Antiochus, but they were also suspicious of Jesus for his faith in the resurrection of the dead. Who could blame them for their skepticism—in their experience, and ours, those who die remain dead. However, Jesus had greater insight into the imagination of God. Where the Sadducees were quick to narrow life after death—in this case to marriage—Jesus envisions a broadening of the next life to where things like marriage are no longer necessary. Jesus quotes their own source, Moses, back to them. The Sadducees focused on contradiction, while Jesus saw possibility; though they seem dead to us, our ancestors are alive to God. When we find ourselves caught on the seeming inconsistencies of our faith, we can be thankful that God has a greater sense of imagination then we do. When things seem impossible, God finds a way. When death seems to win, God raises up to new life. We can be thankful for the contradictions that make us stumble—they are the moments where faith takes over from reason and the possibility of things greater than we can imagine captivates our spirits. God raises in us a faith that surpasses even death.
