33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time: 33 Sunday OT Year C Malachi 4:1-2 Psalm 98:5-6, 7-8, 9 2 Thessalonians 3:7-12 Luke 21:5-19

All change is stressful, even positive ones. Transitions such as moving, renovating, marrying, birthing, switching jobs, or finishing school, are just a few examples of life-shaking events that can take months, sometimes years, to adjust to. Life is at its most comfortable when it is stable and predictable. We are creatures of routine and habit; we can be traditional, conservative, and set-in-our-ways by default.

Even when the stakes are low, we bristle at change. One year, my classmates and I were scandalized when we were informed that our favourite teacher would not be delivering her famous start-of-the-year speech to our class. "But she always gives the talk at orientation," we whined to the program director. We knew we were being silly for complaining. Still, the emotional reaction our community felt was very real. It was our last year of a three-year program, and on some level we were probably upset that we would not be coming back. Even if we could come back, the program itself would never be the same as it was before. We mourn the death of traditions because they remind us just how unstable and contingent life itself can be.

So imagine the scandal caused by Jesus' words about the temple in today's Gospel, "the days will come when not one stone will be left upon another; all will be thrown down." The temple in Jerusalem—God's dwelling place on earth—was the hub for commerce, cultural identity, and worship. Imagine your parish church, your alma mater, city hall, and Eaton's Downtown all rolled into one. It would be the epicenter of all the things that make you who you are: a Christian, a Winnipegger, class of '03. We hope that these things are eternal, because if they live on, in some way we live on too.

The reality is that the things we assume will last, won't. Jesus lists some of the things that can go change in a heartbeat. The country could break out in war, natural disasters could strike, your government could arrest you for your beliefs, and even your own family can turn against you. So should we stockpile canned goods and build a bomb shelter in the basement? Jesus tells us to leave our defense to God, who sends the Spirit to defend us better than we ever could on our own. God defends us with words and wisdom that endure all things. Even the greatest change of all—death itself—is flipped on its head by God's Word. Through the endurance of God's faith, we win our very lives, we gain our souls.

The reality is that the things we assume will last, won't. Jesus lists some of the things that can go change in a heartbeat. The country could break out in war, natural disasters could strike, your government could arrest you for your beliefs, and even your own family could turn against you.
