October 17/18, 2015: 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time

29th Sunday in Ordinary Time: *Isaiah 53:10-11; Hebrews 4:14-16; Mark 10:35-45*

James and John looked with fiery eyes at the other disciples leaning around the dinner table. The brothers had discussed their concern with some of their peers' practices for some time, but had kept their contempt to themselves. Tonight, though, the so-called sons of thunder would live up to their nickname. Enough was enough. They had stood by too long while they watched Jesus' disciples laugh a little too loudly with ne'er-do-well beggars and prostitutes. Sure, Jesus had encouraged them to reach out in charity to some less-visible people: the sick and disabled, women and children, those living in poverty. For the most part, this move had made sense to the brothers—it showed Jesus to be humble and unpretentious and lent credibility to their cause among the people. In James' mind, the other disciples took this too far, getting too chummy with some people with questionable morals. John knew they were taking a big risk bringing it up with Jesus.

So the brothers were nervous and angry when they approached Jesus after the meal was finished. Perhaps it was this combination of apprehension and passion that robbed James of the eloquent words he had earlier worked out to say. Instead James said tersely, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you." John looked away to hide his seething grimace. "That's not what we talked about," he thought. Jesus, smiling to himself, found this bluntness more true to James' personality and decided to play along to see what was on their minds. James and John, still unsure, really didn't know what to make of Jesus' reply, "What is it you want me to do for you?" All manner of possibilities opened up before them. Should they ask him to tighten up the discipline of the group, maybe set some rules? Better still, it came across them to ask Jesus for more authority for themselves—shared power between the brothers—to rein in the more careless of their friends. They had discussed the best way to put this. Jesus showed great thoughtfulness in the way he ate with the disciples; he went beyond good manners, eating together was a sacred, almost prayerful, experience. Jesus was especially careful who he chose to sit at his side for meals, and the brothers knew that they could command their friends' attention and respect should they hold such seats of honour. James and John had decided they should ask to sit at Jesus' left and right hand when he entered his glory.

Jesus' smile quickly disappeared at this request; his grave face didn't show anger, but a deep sadness. Jesus closed his eyes and sighed deeply, "You do not know what you are asking."

When James and John would later see two bandits crucified next to Jesus, they would remember the face Jesus made at their request and they would understand what he meant when he said that he would give his life as a ransom for many. They would no longer be afraid of falling short as disciples. Christ carried those fears with him to the cross, so they could boldly ask for mercy for themselves and for those most in need. ~Tom Bailey-Robertson, Pastoral Associate
