October 18/19, 2014: 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time

29th Sunday in Ordinary Time: Isaiah 45:1,4-6; Psalm 96; 1 Thessalonians 1:1-5; Matthew 22:15-21

Making all the right choices does not guarantee that things will work out. Life seems to have a way of frustrating the well-laid plans of even the most prepared among us. Parents are just one group who live out this kind of turmoil. Before our children are even born, we do all we can to set them up for success. We follow the advice of experts, avoid foods and drugs that can harm them, take the right vitamins, and make our homes ready for a new life. It doesn't end there. No, what follows is a lifetime of concern—albeit, the good kind of worrying that comes from caring about someone more than yourself. Even once they've left the nest, our children are the focus of our guidance. For all our good choices along the way, there is no way to prevent our loved ones from ever suffering. Some hurts are beyond our control to miti-gate or to heal.

The Pharisees tried to strip Jesus of his control by putting him in a no-win situation. They ask him a seemingly innocuous question about paying taxes, but really they were setting him up. If he denounces the tax, he could be accused of rebellion against the Roman Empire. The tax was unpopular, so supporting it would put him at odds with the people. The question was not simply meant to trip Jesus up politically—it was a malicious attempt on his life. Answering either way, Jesus would wind up in enough trouble to get himself killed. Even though Jesus' answer evades this attempt, we know that the Pharisees and the Romans eventually execute Jesus anyways.

Beyond showing us that some people really wanted Jesus to die, or that Jesus was quite wise, this episode shows us the extent of Jesus' faithfulness to the Kingdom of God. Above all else, he radically commits to God's reign on earth. He doesn't just talk about God's kingdom with parables and sayings, he entrusts his life to it. The Pharisees have heard the parables, and they acknowledge he is a great teacher, but they underestimate his dedication to God.

Parents live that kind of commitment to their children; they are our greatest treasure. That's why bringing children for baptism is such a profound act of faith. We take our most precious beloved to be plunged into the tomb with Christ, to be marked with the Holy Spirit, and adopted by God. Baptism is like getting tattoo on one's soul, branding one into the likeness of Christ. When we look at our children, what do we see there? We see a bit of ourselves, but we when we baptize them we are saying that we also see the image of God. In the context of baptism, Jesus' words today cut us to the quick, "Give to God the things that are God's." How can we dare let go our greatest gifts? We can and we do because Jesus trusted himself to God first, so we can trust our children to God too.
