

October 1/2, 2016: 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time:

Habakkuk 1:2-3, 2:2-4, 2 Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14; Luke 17:5-10

After a long day without catching any fish, Jesus instructed his first disciples to set out for deeper waters to try again. They were reluctant, but when they did what he said, they wound up bringing in an absurd number of fish. It was an impossible haul; the boat started to sink. Amazed, Simon Peter fell to his knees and called Jesus "Lord." From then on, they followed Jesus, listened to his teachings, and witnessed many miracles.

In the Gospel of Luke, Jesus is usually referred to simply as "Jesus." Jesus said to his disciples... Jesus went through the town... So when the title Lord shows up, we know a deeper conversation is going on-a word from God is being spoken to the listener. In today's Gospel, the apostles say, "Lord, increase our faith!" After all the disciples had seen and heard from Jesus, why did they now feel inadequate in their belief? Had the parables about wealth spooked them? Perhaps the command to forgive another's sins, even seven times a day, got under their skin. Who in their right mind would forgive someone for the same offense over and over again, let alone all on the same day? They might have been worried that they weren't up to the task. So, they asked for more faith. Jesus had, after all, won them over with astounding feats in the past. The disciples might have been aiming for another overwhelming sign, like the abundant catch of fish.

Instead, Jesus asked his disciples to think smaller. Faith is a matter of little things that make a big difference, like a single spark that gives rise to a roaring fire. It's having the grace to forgive one another, even when the score isn't settled. It's carrying a spirit of gratitude for what we have, even when we have unfulfilled desires. Faith makes friends out of enemies; it heals hurts that have gone untended; it even makes life where there is death.

Sometimes we hold out for more than faith. At times, we want to get even with the people who have done us wrong. Who among us hasn't, at some point or another, wished for more than we are owed? *Lord, we want more!* It's then that Christ assures us: the faith God gives us is enough. So, when we get ahead of ourselves, when we presume to know more than God, Christ writes us a message so clear even a runner at full speed wouldn't miss it. We can wait for the faith we need to face any challenge because the Lord assures us it's coming.

An Invitation to "Listening sessions" in preparation for the Archdiocese of Winnipeg Synod

At Pentecost, Archbishop Gagnon announced that our first Archdiocesan Synod will take place in stages over the next two years, 2016-2018. From September to November we enter the preparatory phase of the Synod, called "Listening Sessions", gatherings where people are invited to voice their views about present needs and future directions for the Church in the Archdiocese of Winnipeg.

"Listening" is the key word for these sessions. Archbishop Gagnon will be present at all sessions to hear the hopes and ideas of those present. It is also an occasion for all of us, not only to share our thoughts, but also to listen to one another and, in so doing, grow in unity and understanding as a community. Finally, in listening to one another, we seek to listen for where and how the Holy Spirit is leading our Church.


"Listening Sessions" have been scheduled throughout the Archdiocese; one for each of the six deaneries.

The format of these meetings is quite simple. Participants will be invited to respond to 3 general questions:

- 1. What do you appreciate most about the Church in the Archdiocese of Winnipeg; especially those things that help you grow in your faith and as a disciple of the Lord?
- 2. Where are we going? What is your vision for the Archdiocese for the coming years?
- 3. What is our responsibility? What do you see as the 3 priority areas that the Archdiocese should focus on? What would you like to accomplish in these areas?

No special knowledge or training is required, only an honest sharing of how you see things and a readiness to listen to others. Participants can respond either verbally or in written form. A written record will be kept of these responses which will guide the subsequent phases of the Synod process.

Everyone in the Archdiocese is invited to attend the listening sessions.
