# October 21/22, 2017: 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time: Isaiah 45:1, 4-6; 1 Thessalonians 1:1-5; Matthew 22:15-21

Our modern lives seem impossibly complicated. We're relentlessly flooded with content. We hear news stories from every corner of the world. We read comments and posts from anybody with thumbs. We see pictures of everybody's business. Despite this banquet of information, we're left starving for meaning. Words are cheaper than ever. Anyone claiming to speak the truth is met with a chorus of refutation in the comment section. Many of us embrace irony as a way to navigate the cacophony of disagreement. If we stay hard to nail down, then we can at least coast above the fray without getting bogged down in a war of words on Twitter. This might help our sanity in the short term, but it leaves us longing for sincerity. How can we authentically engage with one another if we retreat behind the cover of sarcasm?

Jesus' interaction with the Pharisees' followers could very well have been ripped from our own times. The Pharisees approached Jesus, not to engage him in a constructive dialogue, but to tear him down. The encounter was altogether absurd: they celebrated Jesus for his sincerity, while they themselves were entirely disingenuous. Their praise dripped with disdain. With their question on paying taxes they hoped to label him a sycophant or a dissident to the Roman Empire. However, Jesus saw through their scheming. He exposed the ridiculousness of their question and, at the same time, he made a profound statement of faith. He stripped off their smarmy façade and robbed them of their self-righteousness. Jesus' identity was rooted firmly in God and nothing on earth could take that away.

We also encounter people who categorize us so they can write us off. We do the same to others, too. St. Paul recognized that there is a power that comes not just from words, but from the Holy Spirit. This power flows from having been chosen by God, who calls us by name as his own. God names us as his own, so we belong entirely to God. No one has the power to take away what God has chosen. Nor can we deny that divine presence in others. When we begin our interactions with the understanding that each person belongs to God, we see past whatever leads to discord and strife. Christ told us to give to God the things that are God's—this applies to people too. The Pharisees tried to label Jesus, but it didn't stick because God anointed him as his own. Though from time to time we might lose sight of this belonging to God, in ourselves and in others, God's call strips whatever airs we put on. Named as God's own, together we grow in the peace and concord of God's Reign.


