### October 22/23, 2016: 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time

30 Sunday in Ordinary Time: Sirach 35:15-17, 20-22; Psalm 34; 2 Timothy 4:6-8; 16-18; Luke 18:9-14

It would be pretty tough to get out of bed in the morning if we thought we were just like everyone else. I mean, look at what these other people do: they steal, cheat, and lie; they cut people off in traffic; they get into messy relationships; they end up addicted to substances; they wind up in jail; these people are poor. Thank God we're not like that. No siree! God wouldn't let us end up like those people. There's a special force field that keeps us from stuff like that. Maybe it's because we go to church, but mostly I think it's because God just likes us better. How could we make it to the end of the day if this weren't true?

I sympathize with the audience who heard Jesus' parable in today's Gospel--the ones who were righteous and regarded others with contempt. We all have to tell ourselves we're different from others. Otherwise, every time we heard about something awful someone else did, we'd have to believe that we could be just as capable of doing as equally horrible. Otherwise, we'd be no better than all the criminals in jail, all the homeless people on the street, and all the rest of them: junkies, crazies, and psychos. That would be too hard to do. It's easier to tell ourselves that we're separate from those really bad sinners. Thank God!

God goes about things much differently than we do. God really is completely distinct from everyone else. The Lord actually is completely righteous. Instead of dwelling in his holiness, God chose to become like one of us--not only a little like us, but entirely a through-and-through human being. There was no force field protecting Jesus from harm. Though he was innocent, he was tried and convicted like a common criminal, and executed by the state. He died in disgrace and humiliation. Yet, God has raised him above all the rest, and has set all creation at his feet.

We don't have to set ourselves apart from the rest of humanity—even the nasty parts we think we're better than—to raise ourselves up to God. God has already lifted up and exalted one of us—Jesus. The Lord has promised to pick us up too, because of our humanity and not in spite of it.
