

# October 24/25, 2015: 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### 30<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time: Jeremiah 31:7-9; Hebrews 5:1-6; Mark 10:46-52

Jesus asks the same question to Bartimaeus, the blind beggar, as he asked his disciples James and John in last week's gospel, "What do you want me to do for you?" It's humbling to imagine Jesus posing that question to us this day; you'd be in good company if you find it overwhelming to think about. On any given day I have a hard enough time figuring out what to pack for lunch, it's no wonder many of us have difficulty getting in touch with our deepest concerns and needs-those often remain safely hidden from our view and out of sight from others. How many of us hide our vulnerabilities under a cloak of strong independence, personal success, or indulgence? While a perusal through our friends' barrage of Facebook status updates might indicate blissful well-being that's off the charts, chances are there's more going on behind the scenes. The pictures don't show that the new car isn't paid for, the smiling couple fight constantly about money, or that she's been updating her online dating profile for new prospects.

Cries for help can be heard, but are often ignored—it's easier for victims and bystanders alike to pretend like everything is okay. As the cries grow louder though, it gets harder to sustain the illusion. Bystanders go from playing along to actively suppressing the wounded. Many in the crowd ordered Bartimaeus to be quiet. When we smile along with them and agree that things are fine for so long, it's hard to change our tune when they finally realize they're in over their heads.

It's a good thing, then, that we have a high priest like Jesus, one who "is able to deal gently with the ignorant and wayward" and who ventures into those forgotten places to bring us back from exile. Before he heals Bartimaeus, he first addresses the people, and cuts through the act they are playing. Jesus makes it okay for the crowd to see Bartimaeus as needy, to acknowledge his request for help, and to act with compassion together. Was Bartimaeus about to give up? Was he about to quit calling out to Jesus? Would he sink back behind his cloak and disappear into the background? Jesus enlists the crowd's help to encourage Bartimaeus. Heartened from the support, he throws off his cloak and rushes to meet Jesus. God cuts through our pretenses so we can deal kindly and generously with each other, even when we are afraid to face our own neediness, or the neediness of others. Christ is not afraid to ask, "What do you want me to do for you?" Where God reigns, there vulnerabilities are brought to the surface, and shame and weakness give rise to forgiveness and healing.
