

Attending Masses at St. John Brebeuf:

Entry and exit for all Masses via John Brebeuf Place only. The door will be open 30 minutes prior to Masses.

Current maximum capacity is 200 people.

Reservations are no longer needed but masks are now required.

Do not come to Mass or visit the Parish Office if you are feeling ill, particularly if you are experiencing a cough, fever or respiratory symptoms.

Please note that there is no Morning Prayer or Rosary at this time.

Please sign in (preferably with your own pen) when you enter the church.

Please sanitize your hands as you enter for Mass.

Please maintain social distancing of six feet (2 meters) between people while in the building.

For Masses in the church, please limit seating to designated 'angel' pews. Unless you have come as a family unit, individual distancing of six feet (2 meters) within pews is required.

Once you have selected seating, please remain in your seat. except for the receipt of Communion. Parents. please keep your children with you.

Please leave your offering in the designated basket at the main church aisle when you enter for Mass.

Please exit as soon as Mass ends without pausing inside to chat.

Thank you for your understanding and cooperation as we navigate the changing rules and regulations in place for the safety and well being of all.

Children's Faith Formation 2020-2021 (Online Format)

Online classes began Sunday, October 18 and will continue as per the schedule (available at www.sjbcommunity.ca). Please note that:

- Grades 4 to 6 start time will change to **Noon to 12:30pm** to accommodate families with more than one child.
- The scheduled class time for the other grades remains at **11:30am to Noon**.

Registrations are still being accepted for the 2020-2021 year at <u>http://www.sjbcommunity.ca/faith-formation/</u> Registered students will receive a Pflaum booklet and will be working with online resources, crafts and fun activities at home. A catechist will contact you to provide an online link for the classes.

Given the ever-changing circumstances due to the COVID-19 pandemic, by the end of 2020 we will re-evaluate our options for the January-April 2021 term: continue online or return to in-person classes. Parents' input will be appreciated and factored into this decision.

Volunteers Needed:

Volunteer Catechists are needed for the following grades for the 2020/2021 year:

Grade 7/8: (Duties: Preparing and presenting weekly online lesson based on Pflaum lesson guide)

1st Reconciliation/1st Eucharist:

Parents of children in grade 2 who have not registered are asked to register online at www.sjbcommunity.ca as soon as possible for the Sacramental preparation for 1st Reconciliation and 1st Eucharist. This year, parent meetings will be held online, and books will be provided by the parish. Candidates will be asked to sign up for a one-on-one 1st Reconciliation with Fr Wayne on one of three Saturday's during Lent. There will be in-person rehearsal and the Sacrament of 1st Eucharist will take place in the spring. Please watch the parish bulletin and website for a list of important dates, available soon.

Sacrament of Confirmation:

Parents of children in Grade 8 (and those in higher grades who have not yet received the Sacrament of Confirmation) are asked to register online at www.sjbcommunity.ca for preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation. Classes will be held online this year, with books provided by the parish. There will be in-person rehearsal and Confirmation Mass next spring. A list of important dates will be provided soon on the parish website.

From the Archdiocese:

Per the Government of Manitoba October 16 directive, effective Monday, October 19, further restrictions were imposed on indoor and outdoor gatherings to five (5) people. While



these new restrictions do not apply to 'Faith Gatherings', including Mass, they will apply to the celebration of weddings, funerals and baptisms and other special events. The current restrictions for Mass, including social distancing, remain. The use of face masks is also required for all indoor public gatherings.
