October 4/5, 2014: 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time

27th Sunday in Ordinary Time: Isaiah 5:1-7; Psalm 80; Philippians 4:6-9; Matthew 21:33-43

Going over the new Kenaston overpass for the first time is a little daunting if you stop and think about it. Will the lanes be wide enough; will the corners be banked the right amount; will it be strong enough to hold when I'm driving next to a big rig? Rather than pull over to take some measurements and calculate the live load capacity of the overpass for ourselves, we trust the pros and drive on. We place an incredible amount of trust in the engineers and builders who construct our homes and infrastructure. They in turn take their jobs very seriously, as they recognize what is at stake when they put up a new bridge or building.

We put this kind of trust in human builders, yet we sometimes doubt in God's building abilities. Why is it that we don't think twice about crossing a bridge, while we can think of all kinds of obstacles that prevent us, or others, from entering God's Kingdom? Jesus channels the prophet Isaiah to show us the great care God takes in building the Kingdom of Heaven. God thoughtfully chooses a fertile hillside, lovingly protects it with a fence and watchtower, and dotingly tends to the planting and upkeep. God builds the Kingdom with great care so we can trust that there is room for us. Yet we sometimes have a hard time imagining God putting this much effort into us. Maybe we don't consider ourselves worthy of this kind of attention from the Creator of the universe. Like the priests and elders, we question whether God really cares that much for sinners. It made more sense to them that God was too busy preparing a place for perfect people who followed the law to care about the tax collectors and the prostitutes. Chalk it up to a lack of imagination: God couldn't possibly be merciful enough to let sinners into his vineyard. Ultimately, the tenants lacked trust that the landowner would leave a place for them in the vineyard, so they tried to take it over and run it themselves.

It's understandable for the chief priests and elders to be worried. After all, God's ways exceed our understanding, and people tend to fear what they can't comprehend. Yet, even without running the calculations ourselves, we fly over the bridge at 80 KM/H and wind up at home in time for supper. Where might we end up when we place that kind of trust in God? God has already done the prep work, and with greater care than you or I ever could. God builds the kingdom with such care that there's even room for the stones other builders reject.
