October 5/6: 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4, Psalm 95; 2 Tim 1:6-8; 13-14; Luke 17:5-10

Obstinacy—also called "stiffness of neck" or "hardness of heart"—is the opposite of having an open mind. God seeks constantly after conversion in the stoniest of hearts. Sometimes the change comes through a sudden realization. The prophet Nathan confronts David over his sins of murder and adultery. He tells David a parable about a rich man who robs a poor man of everything he owned. When David's anger was kindled against the rich character, Nathan exclaims, "You are the man!" This startling clarity is an "aha!" moment of discovery for David. Among the apostles, Paul is the poster boy for sudden conversion. Struck blind by the light of God, he performs an about-face turn from persecuting the church to building it up.

Other times the process of conversion is slower and features many reversals along the way. The Pharaoh in the Exodus account is unmoved by the plagues unleashed by God through Moses. Even after letting the Hebrew people go, Pharaoh has one last change of heart. He takes off after his former slaves and he winds up drowning in the Red Sea. Did he finally change his mind as the water crashed down on his chariot army? Peter is the apostle whose story exemplifies a gradual change of mind. He makes the trip from fisherman, to steadfast disciple, to a deserter before winding up a cornerstone for Christ's church.

We face our own "mulberry trees" in our own lives: immovable obstacles whose roots run too deep to dig up. It could be the family member who refuses to show up at events because of a disagreement or feud. Perhaps a loved one has hurt you with their drinking, but they refuse to acknowledge the problem. Some of us face the prospect of caring for elderly parents on top of juggling our own lives. Other families are taking on illnessesailments both physical and mental—that not only threaten their loved one's health, but that have sapped the spirit out of them too. We hope for the best, but the sometimes slow work of God can have us wishing—like the apostles in today's Gospel—wishing for more of something: faith, strength, courage. Jesus assures us that the faith God has already given us, even if it only feels like a tiny mustard seed, is enough to soften the hardest of hearts.


World Mission Sunday: World Mission Sunday is on October 20th this year. This is a worldwide collection for the missionary church that provides emergency aid when
