



September 9/10, 2017: 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time: Ezekiel 33:7-9; Psalm 95; Romans 13:8-10; Matthew 18:15-20

Something must have been amiss among his followers for Jesus to lay out this advice on managing conflict in today's Gospel. Under the guise of living in peace, perhaps the interactions in the community had grown superficial. Following Jesus' message of radical love to heart, the disciples may have started to defer to one another, all while ignoring the very real differences between them. So the community tolerated a certain disciple's lackluster teaching. Even though he was short of the required talent, he continued stumbling through his lessons and confusing his listeners. Another disciple continued on with her mission to the poor, even though her ideas of helping others were patronizing and disrespectful to the dignity of the marginalized. In the name of love, the disciples kept their mouths shut about these situations, and many others like them. What a dilemma—for the sake of the group, the members held back their opinions about the obvious problems in the community. Nonetheless, those unvoiced concerns started to surface in other ways—a sarcastic comment here, a seemingly playful joke there. The disciples' nerves were starting to fray.

While it's amusing to imagine what kind of dysfunctional behaviour brought about today's Gospel, it's also uncomfortable since it rings close to home. Every community we belong to is susceptible to conflict. Our families, at work, and yes, even here at church, among God's people—none of these are areas are conflict-free. Each of us could name a couple of conflicts that are brewing, either from our own blunders or from the missteps of others. We can employ different strategies to cope with conflict—ignoring, blaming, minimizing, to name a few. Confrontation of some kind is usually the end result, which is not a bad thing depending on how we go about it.

Christ advises us to confront our conflicts lovingly. The language in the Gospel that the good of the person being confronted must be kept in mind. "Go and point out the fault" address the problem directly, together one-onone, and bring the truth to light with compelling evidence. "If the member listens to you, you have regained that one." The word regain suggests an exchange of something mediocre for something better—trading up, if you will. Not only does the member change, but the relationship between you grows stronger. If the member refuses to listen, do not give up—try again and take a few friends along. Should that fail, bring your conflict to the church.

Love compels us to work out our differences, not merely to cover them up. Christ sought repentance, a conversion to God's mind, not mere acquiescence or blind submission, i.e. a lack of mind altogether. The good news is that Christ heals our relationships by changing our minds with love. The transformative love of God softens our hearts and helps us change our minds about one another when we face conflict together. Christ brings to our conflicts the endless love poured out from the cross. We stand together before the crucified Christ, who brought us back to God despite our sins. While real differences drive us apart, the love of Christ promises to heal any conflict by changing even the hardest of hearts. ~Tom Bailey-Robertson, Pastoral Associate


