Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C

Exodus 32:7-11, 13-14; Ps 51:1-2, 10-11, 15, 17; 1 Tim 1:12-17; Luke 15: 1-32

Being the oldest child is a raw deal. Not only do us firstborns train new parents, but we're expected to help look after our younger siblings. As a child, I told my parents to "Take that baby back!" when they brought home my little sister. So it's easy for me to sympathize with the older brother in Jesus' parable. Little brother blows through his inheritance, which he selfishly asked for in advance, and (surprise, surprise) he comes home with his hat in his hands. It's no wonder that the older brother wants nothing to do with his family. "But when this son of yours came back," he cries, ignoring his own relationship-and responsibility-to his brother. His answer channels something of Cain's response to God after murdering his brother Abel, "Am I my brother's keeper?" (Gen 4:9).

We, too, can cobble together all kinds of defenses when we encounter brokenness. In a culture that worships productivity and independence, the greatest sinners are the people who are unable to take care of themselves. People with mental illness and addictions; those who are sick and dying; those who are unemployed; even children are construed as burdens to be budgeted and accounted for. People in need threaten us, "How can we possibly provide for them all, don't we do enough?" In the face of all these brothers and sisters to care for, it can be easier to sweep them back under the rug. "Brother? What brother?"

The younger son certainly expected this treatment. "I am no longer worthy to be called your son," he tells his father; he is still lost even as he returns home. His hunger was for more than food—he was starving for a place to belong. The father rushes out to lavish his child with the trappings of membership: a robe, a ring, sandals, and a feast in his honour. Seeing this response from his father threatened the oldest son, so he refused to join the celebration. The father pleads with his firstborn to convince him that he, too, belongs, "Son, you are always with me..." When we turn our backs on our sisters and brothers, it is we who end up lost. In those moments, Jesus leaves the feast to seek us out. Our shepherd carries us back to join the flock to the tune of saints and angels rejoicing. Now we can join the search and share in God's joy.
