September 17/18, 2016: 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Year C Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time: Amos 8:4-7; 1 Timothy 2:1-7; Luke 16:1-13

In the prophet Amos' day, people were swept up in a time of unprecedented prosperity. Once faithfully devoted to the Lord, they were now willing to play fast and loose with the rules that God had spelled out for them. Obligations that were the cornerstone of their society came to be seen as obstacles to growing their wealth. Keeping the Sabbath day holy by refraining from work meant a slimmer bottom line. Leaving grain unpicked in the fields as an offering to the poor meant smaller harvests. They even rigged their scales to rip off their neighbours. They couldn't even trust their own objective measures. They lived as though God didn't care about their deeds, so they could live however they wanted. Each of these practices had a deeper value they could no longer see. Resting from work is a way to prevent it from taking over our lives. Giving joyfully to the needy reminds us to be thankful when our needs are met. What good is money is if it costs us our lives?

We too can live as though God doesn't care what we do. To not be held accountable might feel liberating, but it is a shallow freedom. If no one holds us accountable, it means our actions are ultimately meaningless. Imagine showing up to job each day where it doesn't matter whether you are there or not. It might feel nice for a while to not worry about your performance, but after a while it would be boring. Each day would pass without feeling challenged and without making a difference. It's sad enough to feel that way about a job, but it's downright depressing to feel like that about life itself. Without God to hold us to account for our lives, money is a convenient substitute. Of course my life has meaning! Look at my bank balance.

The good news is that God remembers our entire lives through the Eucharist. "Surely I will never forget any of their deeds," says the Lord (Amos 8:7). Being held to account for everything we do is not some scary test we have to pass in order to earn a spot in a faraway heaven. It's the care a parent shows for the things their child does. The child then knows that what she does matters very much. Since our lives have significance to God, we can be generous with our time and money. Our bank balances are not the measure that rule our lives. True wealth comes from living lives of meaning instilled in us from the very beginning by a God who knows us and who cares very much that we do matches who we are-members of the Body of Christ. The minister looks us in the face and says, "The Body of Christ." We say, "Amen." This is the measure that holds us each to account for our lives.
