

## Needs of the Church in Canada:

#### Attending In-Person Masses at St. John Brebeuf:

Reservations are no longer needed to attend Masses.

While in the church, Physical Distancing and the Use of Masks Is Required.

#### A Reminder of Mass Protocols:

**Do not come to Mass if you are feeling ill**, particularly if you are experiencing a cough, fever or respiratory symptoms.

Please sanitize your hands as you enter for Mass.

Please maintain **physical distancing of six feet** (2 meters) between people while in the building. **The Use of Masks is required in the church.** 

Please **leave your offering in the designated basket** at the main church aisle when you enter the worship space.

**Please limit seating to designated 'angel' pews**. Unless you have come as a family unit, individual distancing of six feet (2 meters) within pews is required.

Once you have selected seating, please remain in your seat, except for the receipt of Communion. Parents, please keep your children with you.

Please **exit as soon as Mass ends** without pausing inside to chat.

Thank you for your cooperation and understanding as we navigate the changing rules and regulations in place for the safety and well-being of all.

#### **Good Friday Collection:**

Despite the pandemic's upsetting the usual Good Friday collection, many of you have already used your parish envelopes or donated in other ways.

If you were unable to donate due to our pandemic church closure, a donation is suggested this weekend at our Saturday 5pm or Sunday 10am Mass. Your Good Friday donation can be placed in the offertory basket at the entrance to the main church aisle.

# From the Archdiocese:

## General Dispensation:

The current general dispensation from Sunday Mass concludes on September 12, 2021. Taking into consideration the current state of the pandemic, this general dispensation is now extended until Sunday, November 21, 2021.

## National Day for Truth and Reconciliation:

Thursday, September 30, 2021, is Canada's National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. This day is meant to honour the victims and survivors of Canada's residential school system along with their families. This day is also a day that marks the importance of the relationships between the First Peoples of this land and the non-Indigenous People of Canada. It also presents an opportunity to listen to and reflect on the stories within our Indigenous and First Nations communities. I would encourage everyone to take part in community-organized activities marking this first National Day for Truth and Reconciliation.

I will preside at Mass on September 30, 2021, at 11:30am, at St. Kateri Tekakwitha Parish in Winnipeg. The celebration will be live-streamed and will be made available through our Archdiocesan YouTube Channel (search, "Archdiocese of Winnipeg").

The Catholic Centre will be closed in observance of the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, as will the St. John Brebeuf Parish Office.

Your offering will be deducted from your bank account or credit card once per month. Forms and further information are available at **www.sjbcommunity.ca**.


