

Every year, the Bishops of Canada make an appeal for financial assistance to support their work and the work of each diocese by means of the Collection for the Needs of the Church in Canada. The President of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB), the Most Reverend Paul-André Durocher, Archbishop of Gatineau, has described this Collection as "an opportunity to all the faithful to help their dioceses collaborate in financing the regional episcopal assemblies (the Atlantic, Que-



bec, Ontario, and the West) and also the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB). These associations support the Bishops in their local ministry and in working together on issues of common concern." Any additional revenues raised help the diocese support its own diocesan pastoral programs and other activities. The CCCB is the national assembly of the Catholic Bishops in Canada, and includes the Bishops of the Eastern Catholic Churches.

The Collection for the Needs of the Church in Canada will be help September 26 and 27, 2015. Through your contribution to the Collection, you too can collaborate with the Bishops in their ministry to teach, sanctify and govern.

September 19/20, 2015: 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

25th Sunday in Ordinary Time: Wisdom 2:12, 17-20; James 3:16-4:3; Mark 9:30-37

It's an unwritten law of physics that if someone starts playing guitar, a better player will immediately emerge and show them up. It could come from the clerk demoing a guitar for a new player, maybe from a kid with amazing chops trying a guitar in the next aisle. It doesn't really matter who is playing, it all sounds the same to me; it always sounds better than me. It's uncanny. My sister brought home an acoustic guitar once. It was my job to crush her enthusiasm by showing her the hardest riffs I knew. "Must be something wrong with the action", I declared, after miffing a couple of runs. My uncle asked if he could try. He quickly buried me by casually picking away legatos at 20 notes per second, "Action feels fine to me." Newton's fourth law strikes again.

The disciples also knew a thing or two about insecurity. They were too afraid to ask what Jesus meant when he told them that the Son of Man is to be betrayed and killed, only to rise again. Instead, they busied themselves arguing who would get to be Jesus' right hand man. When Jesus confronted them, they immediately clammed up, aware that they had been engaging in the worst kind of empty posturing. They all knew none of them had the skill to back up their boasting, and they fully expected Jesus was going to destroy them with the practiced licks of a cover band veteran trying out the shop's best guitar on a busy Saturday morning.

Something else happened instead. Christ assured them with a faith that squelched their insecurities. He sat down, called them to himself, and taught them. "Whoever wants to be first, must be last." Becoming last is when a skilled musician uses her abilities so that her band mates sound better. It's when the whole family lets the youngest win at Monopoly. It's the team captain who picks the weakest kid first, because it matters more for him to play than to win the game. It's when we welcome strangers into our neighbourhoods, even when they don't agree with us.

Loving others so freely is not cheap; it always comes with a price. Jesus knew he would pay dearly for the love he was showing the world. The way to God is not one of security and certainty, but vulnerability. It is in the inconvenience, the cost, the wounds, the sacrifice, where God's love abides. We can afford to pay the price demanded by unconditional charity because Christ paid it first. He is with us every time we are asked to give of ourselves for the sake of others. Christ assures us with faith each time we bear the cost of loving others will be worth it.
