September 20/21, 2014: 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

25th Sunday in Ordinary Time: Isaiah 55.6-9; Psalm 145; Philippians 1.20-24,27; Matthew 20.1-16

We've all had moments where we missed the point; Those times when one person presumes to be on the same page as another, goes ahead and acts in good faith, only to have the situation blow up. Maybe it was from putting your foot in your mouth, or it might have been something more serious where you hurt someone you care about. Whatever the circumstances, these moments are often caused when we make honest or careless assumptions.

Take the rich man in the Gospel, who asked Jesus what he must do to inherit eternal life. Jesus tells him to follow the law, which the young man can proudly say he has kept, but he wanted more to do, so Jesus gave him one, "Then sell all you have and come follow me." I imagine the young man's face turning ashen as he visualizes tossing away all the hard work he put into building his wealth. He might have expected that Jesus would congratulate him on his righteousness and invite him to give God thanks at the temple. It turned out that God is bigger than the law, bigger than his expectations, and that eternal life would take everything he had. Oh, if only he could hold something back for himself! I'm sure Jesus would have rather held back as well. Maybe he could just go to jail for a while instead of the cross? No, Jesus serves God so fully and radically that he breaks us out of our tiny presumptions about God's Kingdom.

Following this encounter with the rich man, the disciples are curious to know if they measure up, since they had already left everything to follow Jesus. Jesus replies with a parable, "The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out early in the morning to hire laborers for his vineyard." "Oh," think the disciples, "that's us!" This landowner is really tenacious about finding workers, and he returns to the market several times throughout the day to hire more help. As Jesus got to the part where the one's hired last were paid a full day's wage for only a few hours work, I wonder, did the disciples get wide-eyed? Did a tinge of anticipation take hold in their hearts that maybe, just maybe, they—those first followers of Jesus—were more special then everyone else after all? As Jesus told the rest of the story, some of those disciples might have been feeling the same way the rich man felt: disappointed; maybe even a little cheated. The may have assumed more perks came with this discipleship gig.

No one wants to be last, at least, not in everything. We might expect that putting ourselves in the back of the line in some parts of our lives entitles us to jump to the front at other times. See, I kept the law! See, I left everything to follow you! Yet, the kingdom of God is so much more than keeping the rules and detaching from stuff. When we presume these things will earn us a place at the front, there's Jesus, standing in the back, laughing at our assumptions. We thought there would be a lineup to get into the kingdom and that we were supposed to fight for a place at the front. Turns out God is more generous, more merciful, and more imaginative than that.


