Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C Amos 8:4-7, Psalm 113, 1 Tim 2:1-7, Luke 16:1-13 **Fight the Charges**

Resting on the Sabbath from work and business is an act of faith. Taking a holiday from earning or spending money once a week puts our lives into perspective: God is the Lord of our lives; money is not. God made the Sabbath as a reminder of the freedom from slavery that was won for them in the exodus from Egypt. "Remember that you were a slave in the land of Egypt, and the LORD your God redeemed you" (Lev 15:15).

The prophet Amos lived in a time of relative prosperity in Israel, and the people forgot that God was in charge. They were so captivated by making money, they forgot to keep God's covenant. The rich despised the Sabbath and dealt tight-fistedly with their neighbours. They had lost the wonder and the faith to imagine a nation where God provides for everyone's needs-the kind of people God destined them to be. But the Lord is not so short-sighted, "Surely I will never forget any of their deeds" (Amos 8:7). The people would again lose their freedom, this time to Assyrian invaders, and the nation would enter a time of exile.

The scribes and Pharisees had balked at how generously Jesus dealt with sinners, and after this encounter he tells his disciples a curious parable about the dishonest (or is it shrewd?) manager. Ambiguity abounds in this parable: the steward isn't described as "dishonest" at first—he is accused of mismanagement. The allegations may be true, or they might not. Whatever the case, the steward fights the charges that money rules over him. He goes out and cooks the books by cancelling some of the debt owed to his master. His actions seem to say, "He thinks I squander. Oh, I'll show him squandering!"

In a surprise twist to the story, the master tips his hat to the steward's imaginative and cheeky decisions. Fight the rule of money, Jesus says. God has prepared a place for us where all are equal; a place where food and drink are shared without cost. It takes faith and creativity to keep money from getting in our way. We can live like we're already there and deal generously with our neighbours because God-not money-rules our lives. Tom Bailey-Robertson, Pastoral Associate
