25th Sunday in Ordinary Time The Virtue of Humility

Love is the crowning virtue, but spiritual writers agree that humility is the foundational virtue. There's a reason for that: Most early Christian writers were monks who could live more in peace if they competed to be the most humble instead of the most successful. And humility is much easier to practice in a monastery among like-minded people than in the real world where everyone proudly jostles for first place.



Humility is a Christian virtue. Ancient Roman and Greek philosophers considered it a bad trait, fit only for children and old people who had something to be humble about. Otherwise, humility was seen as a weakness. But since we are Christians, let's leave that quarrel to history and trace humility's Christian progress. The best-known treatise was by the sixth-century Saint Benedict. He carefully constructed a ladder of humility with 12 steps. A modern Benedictine reduced those to three general aspects: humility as dying to self, as the grace of salvation, and as the imitation of Christ. Let's look briefly at each.

Dying to self. Human beings are originally created as images of God, therefore naturally inclined toward goodness. But since the fall of our ancestors, we all have a natural inclination toward evil. Tradition says that the Fall was a result of pride; therefore, the opposing virtue would be humility. If pride is an inordinate expression of self-seeking, then the antidote would be selflessness, a certain dying to self: humility.

The grace of salvation. When the natural instinct of survival is buttressed by the sin of pride, individuals begin to believe that they are self-sufficient, that they can get what they need by themselves. This easily morphs into the unholy notion that we can even save ourselves. Humility gives us a real taste for the power of sin, and therefore an appreciation of the grace of humility, which knows that only God saves.

The imitation of Christ. It is abundantly clear that Jesus blessed the poor, liked weak children, applauded humble people and railed against the rich and proud. More importantly, he was himself humble. And if Jesus is the mentor for humanity, the template of moral behavior, then imitation of his humility would be essential for those who follow him. In recent years, there has surfaced a Benedictine nun who says: "Wait a minute. That may be fine for men, but women have a different perspective." Sister Joan Chittister maintains that women have a different psychology, therefore a different spirituality.

She says that humility is good for men because they are naturally prideful and aggressive, while women are naturally reserved. If humility is pressed on women, that can make them personally submissive and socially subordinate. Chittister rejects obedience without participation and patience that leads to abuse. She thinks that the same virtue of humility should be practiced in radically different ways by women and men.

For example, Benedict's ninth degree of humility speaks to the value of silence. Chittister thinks that is valuable only for men, since women's' temptation is to succumb to social expectation to maintain a respectable self-image. She says: "To be true to humility in a patriarchal world, men must learn to listen; women must learn to speak the silence that has been imposed on them for centuries — without apology, without timidity, without fail."

I cannot help noting, still, that underlying all gender differences there is a basic self-centered tendency that requires an offsetting discipline. As in the case of racism, sexism requires some kind of reparation, and psychology must be served, but not at the cost of spirituality. Benedict is right: The love of Christ urges us to die to self, give in to grace and imitate our crucified savior. Fr. James Smith Reprinted with permission from Celebration


