September 23/24, 2017: 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time: Isaiah 55:6-9; Ps. 145; Philippians 1:20-24, 27; Matthew 20:1-16

Anyone who has ever worked on a group project can relate to today's gospel. Despite making different contributions to the project, everyone receives the same reward. Not only is this unfair, but, it also incentivizes laziness. The harder one member works, the more others are inclined to coast by. Once a lead workhorse emerges, the rest are content to load their burdens on and walk behind the cart pretending to push. The teacher gives the fakers the same grade as the most effectual worker, overvaluing the former and cheapening the latter. Undeserved credit and unrecognized effort both leave a bad taste. Surely the Kingdom of Heaven won't taste like a bitter group project.

Yet, this is the picture Jesus paints with his parable of the labourers in the vineyard. The Kingdom of Heaven will not be fair—some will be overcompensated for their effort. All of us know what it is like to be surprised by God's generosity. To feel God's grace is an overwhelming experience. Imagine the dire straits of those last workers—nervously shifting on their feet as the sun sinks low in the sky. Their empty stomachs were growling and they had nothing on hand to fill them. Even though the single hour left in the day would not earn enough to satisfy their needs, still they stood in the market. The call to work came, but they entered the vineyard forlorn, for they would still be down for the day. Another day wasted in vain, they would have to start again tomorrow even further behind than before. As they lined up for their supposedly meagre pay, a sudden surprise changed their whole outlook—they received a whole day's worth of wages. God transformed their despair into hope with unexpected abundance.

We've been startled by such sudden transformations too. It's the cranky neighbour who shows up unrequested and shovels your driveway after a blizzard. It's the long lost box of mementos that seems to turn up after someone dies that sparks memories to sooth a family's rising tensions. It's crying in the car after the job interview that felt so terrible, only to come home to an offer waiting in the voicemail. Whenever we expect to be punished, judged, cast out, and pushed away, God's grace transforms us and we find mercy, peace, and belonging. These moments are fleeting though. We also know what it feels like to work day in and day out and not feel any different. We grumble against God when our lives are boring, adequate, and mediocre, even as we eat our fill of daily bread. We dare to resent that which has been given to us, all because someone else received the same reward for less work. In the parable, the landowner reminds those embittered workers that they are not in charge. God freely chooses to be generous in ways that are beyond our sense of fair. We can let go of our own expectations—those only limit our vision of what God can do. God transforms us by exceeding our expectations in surprising ways.




