

Needs of the Church in Canada:



September 28/29, 2019: Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Annual 'Season of Creation' celebration:

The Season of Creation is an annual celebration to protect creation that started on September 1st and ends on the Feast of St. Francis on October 4th. In 2015, Pope



Francis wrote "Laudato Si", an Encyclical letter pleading with us to take responsibility in the care of our world. His Holiness proclaimed September 1st, the first day of the "Season of Creation", to be the "World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation." He invites us to "weep with the earth, our common home" and to do something concrete in the healing of creation according to Creator's dream for all people and all creation. It is a day and a season to reaffirm our shared vocation as stewards of creation.

Learn About Climate Change:

There is a strong scientific consensus that climate change is caused by human action and will very likely have catastrophic consequences if not tackled urgently (with the poor suffering the most). The world needs a fair, ambitious and legally binding global agreement in the COP21 summit at Paris to keep the global temperature increase below 1.5 degree Celsius (relative to pre-industrial levels). The latest scientific findings are best summarized in the latest report from the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC), which is the internationally accepted authority on climate change scientific matters, operating in a peer -reviewed format and leveraging the inputs of thousands of scientists and other experts. This report was explicitly supported by all governments of the world including oil producer states (as they all participate in the UNFCCC process) and by many Vatican statements. Everybody agrees on the urgency and severity of the climate crisis.

From the Archdiocese:

We invite you to attend the public presentation, "Healing the Church from Clergy Sexual Abuse: A Call to the Catholic Faithful". The session will be given by Sr. Nuala Kenny, SC,



who is an acknowledged expert on the pathology of Clergy sexual abuse. She is a medical doctor, ethicist, professor, well-known author and speaker, and consultor to the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops. The Winnipeg session will be held Thursday, October 10, 7pm at Petrus Hall, 2624 Inkster Blvd. Admission is free.
