

September 2/3, 2017: 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time: Jeremiah 20:7-9; Psalm 63; Romans 12:1-2; Matthew 16:21-27

Humans are known for our pattern-seeking. We find ships sailing in the clouds, animal shapes in the night stars, and faces burnt into our toast. This ability helps us make sense of our lives. From seemingly random events, we can discern a pattern and form a narrative that grounds our existence. Some skeptics point to this human trait as a way of explaining away religious belief—it's simply a product of our overactive imaginations. While this trait may help explain the persistence of conspiracy theories or other anti-scientific stances, religious faith finds its basis not in mere assent to beliefs, but in the power of God to transform our lives. This power is so overwhelming, we can't help but respond to it. God's claim on our lives overshadows competing demands placed on us by the world.

The prophet Jeremiah experienced this transformation first-hand. He described the claim God made on his life as an irresistible enticement, "like a burning fire shut up in my bones; I am weary with holding it in, and I cannot." Jeremiah faced derision, reproach, and mockery, yet he pursued the path God laid out for him. Faith for Jeremiah was not a matter of following a pattern. In fact, the outward signs pointed him the other way: towards abandoning his course. He found no encouragement through external success or a gain in reputation. From a worldly point of view, the narrative was not shaping up so well for Jeremiah. Even in the face of overwhelming obstacles, Jeremiah kept the faith.

Today's epistle reading expresses a similar sentiment. St. Paul warns against modelling ourselves after the outward shape of the world. True understanding comes when our minds are aligned with the will of God. God's mind is set on heavenly things which are higher than we can envision, so we encounter God's ways as mysterious and alien to us. When Jesus showed his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem to suffer and die, Peter takes Jesus aside and forbids him. It's telling that Jesus blames Peter's lack of understanding for failing to respond to the mystery of God's ways—Peter was reasoning with the mind of a creature, not with the mind of God.

It takes a transformation of our minds to wrap our heads around the ways of heaven. The good news is that God shapes our minds after the mysterious pattern of suffering and redemption. Thinking with worldly minds, Jesus' death on the cross was an utter failure. He was the ultimate loser. Though innocent and honest, Christ was charged and prosecuted on the basis of false charges. Though all-powerful, mere creatures rendered Christ completely helpless. Once an effective preacher and healer, Christ declined to save himself. By the standards of the worldly and the wise, Christ messed up. Yet, thinking with the mind of God, Christ's death and resurrection was the victory to end all victories. It's not something any of us can avoid—we will all undergo suffering at some point. With the eyes of faith, we see the paradox of our suffering—that which would most want not to go through becomes the very thing that saves us.




