Wisdom 9:13-18 Philemon 9b-10, 12-17

Luke 14:25-33

How are your New Year's resolutions coming along? Often our plans fall to the wayside after all, we're only human—and our focus shifts to the next project. Meanwhile, the exercise bike or the "learn-a-language" software languishes in the corner or on the shelf. "For the reasoning of mortals is worthless, and our designs are likely to fail," chides today's first reading. God's plans, on the other hand, have the power to save us. The Holy Spirit pulls us out of our ruts and sets us on the path to freedom. We live in a world full of wrinkles and creases, no

matter how hard we might try to smooth things out. Jesus breaks into this world announcing a reversal of fortunes, a Kingdom where the captives are set free and the hills and valleys are levelled.

Luke's Gospel shows this in action when Jesus addresses a large crowd described as "travelling" alongside him. Some are perhaps attracted by his message of hope for the hopeless, others might merely be curious about this bizarre preacher. But Jesus is after more than just tourists and observers; he wants active participants in his mission. He wants them to stop travelling, get behind him, and start following him. Nothing else comes first, not our families, and not even life itself. The requirement of discipleship is to carry the cross and follow Christ. But we need empty hands to pick up the cross. Jesus pulls us out of our limitations and makes it possible for us to carry the cross.

To do this, Jesus uses the strongest word he can to make his point: "hate". This should make us uncomfortable, because our families matter a great deal to us. It's also very liberating. While the world cares very much who our parents are, where we were born, or what school we went to, these things don't matter to God. God wants disciples with empty résumés. Jesus has already carried the cross for us, so now we can pick it up, too, and follow him into the Kingdom of freedom.

This Kingdom is marked by a radical reordering of relationships. In the second reading, Paul asks Philemon to receive his servant Onesimus "no longer as a slave but as more than a slave, a beloved brother." It remains highly problematic that Paul never outright condemns slavery as a social sin and that he counsels Onesimus to return to his master. Christians must take a stand against such human trafficking. Paul expected Jesus' imminent return, so he recommended people remain in whatever state when they were called as Christians; married, single, or slaves (1 Cor 7:20-21). Nonetheless, the Christian community welcomed everyone, slaves included, into God's family as sisters and brothers. In this way, disciples who "hate" their relatives are free to extend familial lines beyond their blood relatives. Tom Bailey-Robertson, Pastoral Associate


