FROM SORROW TO JOY!

Last Sunday we celebrated Gaudete Sunday and this past week we have been lighting the pink or rose candle on our Advent Wreaths. Gaudete Sunday's second reading is from Philippians 4:4-7 that begins: "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near." Gaudete is Latin for the English word: Rejoice.

Some of us might think that now the Church is telling me to be happy and jolly just like the secular world. But that is not the meaning of Gaudete! Happiness is a feeling based upon circumstances while Joy is at attitude that defies circumstances. Elise M. Boulding a Norwegian-born American Quaker sociologist had this to say about the subject: For the real difference between happiness and joy is this: happiness is grounded in this world, but joy is grounded in eternity. Happiness cannot encompass suffering and evil. Joy can. Happiness depends on the present. Joy leaps into the future and triumphantly creates a new present out of it.

So even though the days continue to get shorter. Even though the floods are rising in British Columbia. Even though tornadoes are swirling around the United States. Even though Omicron has reared its ugly head prolonging this never ending pandemic. We can still be joyful and rejoice because our Hope is in the Lord. Jesus is the foundation of our Joy! Putting the focus on ourselves we despair but putting the focus on Jesus we Rejoice! "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near." (Phil. 4:4)
