#### **CR CORNER**



We at times we need to ask ourselves the question: "How much time and energy do I spend on things that I feel can give me a sense of security?" We purchase the most expensive material items believing that they will make us

happy but ultimately, they will diminish in worth or we will simply lose interest in those things. When we come to that place in our lives where we will eventually complete our earthly life, we begin to come to a belief that we will have to let go of all that we have accumulated on this earth and come before the face of Christ. Yet when we take life for granted and think that we will always have another day ahead of us, we continue to seek a sense of security here and now. Advent, which we begin this weekend, is the season of the Church year that jolts us back to reality that we are to live and work for the life that will be our permanent existence one day in the Kingdom of heaven. Jesus in the Gospel gives us a fair warning of this reality by saying to his followers: "Be on guard lest your spirits become bloated with indulgence and drunkenness and worldly cares that the great day will suddenly close in on you like a trap. The day I speak of will come when all who dwell on the face of the earth, so be on the watch. Pray constantly for the strength to escape whatever is in prospect, and to stand secure before the Son of Man." How can I assure that I will stand secure before the Son of Man?.....to love others, particularly the hurting, marginalized and the poor; to seek reconciliation with others in which I may be divided; to die to my selfindulgence and greed. Being receptive to these virtues which comes from God's grace will bring me closer to God and feel his loving embrace when I meet him face to face.

#### REVERSE ADVENT CALENDAR


