CR CORNER



The Advent-Christmas cycle in the liturgical year has to do primarily with the presence of Jesus Christ, past, present and future and so this liturgical time is divided up into three parts.

The **first** part of Advent (1st Sunday of Advent to December 16) deals with the <u>future</u> coming of Christ. It boldly announces Christ's second coming and encourages us to be awake, alert and prepared for "the Day of the Lord". The readings at Mass are identical to those of the end of the liturgical year and so the spiraling of liturgical time unfolds.

The **second** part of Advent (December 17 to December 24) deals with the <u>past</u> presence of Jesus. It deals with Christ's first coming among us by the power of the Holy Spirit and with Joseph and Mary's cooperation in God's plan. This is really the time to celebrate and remember his past birth among us.

The **third** part of the cycle (Christmas Eve until the Baptism of our Lord) deal with the <u>present</u> reality of Christ in our midst today! The Christmas season is not primarily about the past event of his birth, as most unfortunately believe it is; this season is primarily about "Emmanuel", which means: God With Us! Even though the secular world will be finished with Christmas by Christmas day, as Christians we focus our attention upon the fact that the child once born in Bethlehem is STILL AMONG US NOW!

May we heed his future coming and be prepared! May we celebrate his first coming amongst us! May we BE and SEE his presence to and for one another! We pray that Emmanuel will bless you and yours with his special gifts of faith hope and love, now and in the upcoming year!

MARY, THE HOLY MOTHER OF GOD




