CR CORNER



With just a few days away from Christmas, it is appropriate that we put attention on Mary, our mother. Jesus is of course, the Wordmade-flesh and is the reason for this great feast. However, it was Mary's humble

cooperation with the plan of salvation God had for his people that made the Incarnation of God a reality. In today's Gospel, Elizabeth calls Mary *blessed* because God chooses her to be the mother of Jesus.

To grow in love for Jesus and to be with God one day in heaven, we must imitate Mary's example of being obedient to God's will and God's plan for our lives. We must also turn to our Blessed Mother to intercede on our behalf so that we may be receptive to the graces to remain steadfast in faith and love of our Lord.

Elizabeth's visit to Mary strengthened her to believe in the message God planned for her and for her son, John the Baptist. The angels announced that her son would be great in the eyes of God and humankind and that he would prepare a people fit for the Lord (Luke 1:17). This was not easy for Elizabeth to believe since she was known to be barren. Nevertheless, the word of God was fulfilled, and John was born.

Mary continues today to help people believe that what God promises for his people will be fulfilled. Elizabeth asked the question "why should the mother of my Lord come to see me?" Do each of us ask the same questions about whether or not we are worthy and fit for the kingdom or why would Jesus come to the earth to save someone like me?" Mary's "yes" to God's invitation even though she did not always understand how this could come about, helps guide us to echo that same "yes" to God and to trust in his loving providence even when we don't always understand.

For more than a hundred years, St. Peter's has trained a majority of our diocesan Priests – and those of so many Canadian dioceses. Of the current Hamilton seminarians, the majority are at St. Peter's, which is one of only three English-speaking seminaries in Canada. Hamilton Priests have also served on the seminary's staff. The seminary is in need – these funds were required for St. Peter's to continue its mission of forming Priests, deacons and lay ministers – and its vitality is important to the long-term outlook for vocations in Hamilton.
