CR CORNER



There is a common theme in our three Scripture readings today, i.e., of our unworthiness to be called. In Isaiah 6 after a vision of the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty, the prophet says: "Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips."

Then in 1 Corinthians Paul speaks about those to whom Jesus had appeared and called and says: "Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. 9 For I am the least of the apostles, unfit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God." Lastly, in today's Gospel from Luke 5 when Jesus causes a great haul of fish after a night of catching nothing Simon Peter fell down before Jesus and exclaims: "Go away from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man!" Each of them has taken the spotlight off of God and placed it upon themselves which has lead them to despair.

However, this theme which focuses our attention upon our unworthiness is secondary to the main theme that focuses our attention on the fact that: "God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong." (1 Cor. 1:27)

To Isaiah God replies whom shall I send and who will go for us? In other words: "I need YOU!" or "I can see that you are not perfect, I am not calling you because you are perfect. I am calling you because I AM perfect!"

By virtue of God's grace, Paul was able to work through his unworthiness and states: "But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me has not been in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me."

To Simon desire that Jesus go away from him Jesus replies, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people." After when they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed him.

None of us are called because we are good. We are called because God is good! Before Holy Communion we do not say: "O Lord I am SO worthy that you enter under my roof." However we say: "I am NOT worthy!" Because, only worthy is the Lamb that was slain for our sins. Let us stop using "false humility" as an excuse to not answer God's call!
