CR CORNER



We do not know it but every day we wake up with choices that can bring life or death to ourselves and to our relationships. At the heart of our spiritual, emotional, physical, and mental

well-being lies the ability in most of us to choose to be well, whole and more fully alive; or not. This is precisely what Jesus tapped into through a life of prayer and choosing to make good decisions that were rooted in selfless love. When faced with the perplexing issues of his day he prayed and journeyed outward to reveal a wisdom that helped people to identify and see beyond their own wickedness, greed and infidelity. His actions were not about his own need for affirmation or praise but for the well-being of all of the people he loved and encountered. When faced with illnesses in others that the greatest prophets could not heal, he relied on the power of God's love working through him and the faith of the sick person to bring about profound healings. He also faced death in a way that trusted in God's ability to bring new life from it. Jesus always chose life and desired to share it with the world.

Today, we find in our midst outward displays of hatred, blockades against our opponents, people going on strike, and still others demanding rights to a resource that when extracted would have detrimental consequences to some and beneficial outcomes for others. In all of these disputes there are often attempts to dehumanize one another. In these areas of conflict we as Christians are called to be Christ-like. Honest, upright, faithful to our words and commitments while desiring to settle with those we disagree with as soon as possible. God wants us to rehumanize ourselves and our neighbours through our choosing to be more Christ-like. We reflect on our experiences and make a conscious choice to love, forgive and make other good decisions that are rooted in selfless love. And in the situations and circumstances that we find ourselves in we can aid our discernment of how to respond by imagining what action or inaction would better bring about the fruits of the Holy Spirit. Namely, love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, faithfulness, meekness, and selfcontrol. Like Christ, we may have to surrender many things to make better choices. But in the end our readings this Sunday tell us that it's worth it. Reminding us that making good and selfless decisions not only changes our lives for the better, but continues to reveal Christ's life, goodness, and eternal hope for all of humanity. Especially that which is lost, broken, unfaithful, and unable to transform itself.


