CR CORNER



The early Church was formed around Jesus' mission of healing, teaching, and praying.
And in doing what Christ did, the Church became a messy place because it reached out to those whose lives were seen as impure or unholy. It followed Jesus'

example of chastising those who wanted to sanitize everything religious with purification rituals. Rituals that often succeeded in "sanitizing" religious sects from those who were unwanted or threatened those in positions of privilege and power. Remembering that Jesus found the source of God's mission and presence restoring justice to those deemed "unclean," Jesus marks the "dirty" as the sacred and loved. And they were shining examples of what it meant to be healed and redeemed by God whenever they admitted their brokenness and asked Jesus to forgive, heal, and strengthened them. He became the Messiah that didn't fit into the religious structures of his day. He was too ordinary and different for the powers that be.

In many circles today walls that divide are being built in the name of protection and justice. But are these walls Jesus would build? Do they embrace or keep out those whom Jesus came for? Do I build walls around me and become oppressed with keeping my hands clean? If we are to be Christ's presence in the world today I would like to suggest that we revisit his message of bringing justice and healing for those who live on the margins and are often seen as "dirty." That may mean brining down some walls in our lives and being driven out at times by those who disagree with us. It will also mean that our hands will become "dirty" too as we go to the "messier" places in society. But it's worth it because of Jesus' promise that we will find new life there. New opportunities for us to grow in awareness of our personal and social sins while proclaiming that Christ remains attentive to the cries of the poor. In our imperfect efforts to break down walls and engage more fully with those on the margins this week, may we rediscover the transforming power of his love and the great privilege of becoming servant to those most in need.
