FROM SORROW TO JOY!

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord and we read the account of the three Magi coming to bring gifts to the infant Jesus. We may quickly dismiss the story as a cute account of little significance. Some have light-heartedly asked what if the three men were women: Three wise women would have asked directions, arrived on time, helped deliver the baby, brought practical gifts, cleaned the stable, made a casserole and there would have been peace on earth!

However, the deeper significance of the story is that salvation is open to all. I have listened to a grandmother ask me if her unbaptized granddaughter who died would get to heaven. I shared with her the story of the Magi. I have had a husband and his Jewish spouse ask me if one day they could be together in paradise. I shared with them the story of the Magi. I have had so called "good" Catholics come to me and say that they think "bad" Catholics will not be saved. I shared with them the story of the Magi.

Today's Solemnity reveals to us what we call in theology: God's Universal Salvific Will! That means that it is God's deepest desire that everyone should be saved and that no one should be lost. God desires to and is able to save everyone! No one is outside of God's plan for salvation! We don't understand how it works. In fact, we often try to throw huge obstacles to some to be able to enter into heaven. I think that God just laughs at our feeble attempts to exclude those who are not like us. This Good News of Salvation for all turns our Sorrow into Joy!
