CR CORNER



How appropriate is today's second reading for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. The Apostle Paul writes to the Corinthians: "For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with

Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit." 1 Cor. 12:12-13

One of the greatest scandals in the Christian Church which was united until 1054 A.D. is the fact that we now speak about various Christian Churches. Some sources say there are over 33,000 different Christian denominations worldwide. This is a far cry from the deepest desire of Christ: "that they may all be one. As you, Father, are in me and I am in you, may they also be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me." (John 17:21)

In the last millennium and the present one, Christian have fought with each other, refused to allow their children to marry one another, refused to attend one another's Church services and spoken disparagingly about each other. This brings great shame to all of us as followers of Jesus who desired that we might all be one. It also goes against his fundamental belief that if we were one the world would believe that you have sent me.

Each of us needs to examine our own biases and prejudices to see if we somehow don't embrace our fellow Christians as we embrace one another. However, in this very egocentric and divisive time we sometimes are not even willing to embrace fellow Catholics.

Often we judge the situation in the Holy Land and question why our Jewish and Muslim brothers and sisters cannot come to peace. We do this while the various Christian sects in the Holy Sepulchre (the holiest Christian site) often come to blows with each other about sharing the sacred space. Perhaps as Christians we need to increase the respect and acceptance of one another before we expect others to do the same?
