### **SORROW TO JOY!**

As we continue to hear in the news, and from the stories of our Indigenous brothers & sisters, there is so much pain and sorrow associated with the legacy of residential schools in Canada. Thankfully, through the working of the Holy Spirit, the Church is recognizing the voices of Indigenous communities. I think of Pope Francis' historic meeting with Indigenous leaders a couple months ago and his planned visit to Canada this summer. I also think locally of our ReconciliAction Circle and the partnership with Anishnabeg Outreach.

Last weekend, Fr. Toby offered a helpful teaching after Mass about the Two Row Wampum Belt, a historic symbol of peace and cooperation between Indigenous and non-Indigenous peoples. We began building our own Wampum Belt out in front of the church as part of our Native Garden, and invited the parishioners to place a stone. It was a joyful experience, with young and old alike contributing to this symbol of truth and reconciliation. May God continue to bless our efforts, may Jesus heal the wounds of the past, and may the Holy Spirit guide us towards a new relationship of understanding and respect.


