#### **CR CORNER**



The creation story of Genesis provides us with the message that God is the source of all life and his wonderful gift to humanity is to grant us dominion over these gifts to use for his glory.

Adam and Eve, who represent humanity in scripture, have been granted these gifts and through serving God and being obedient to his commands, they would enjoy fulfilment and happiness. The evil one's temptation for Adam and Even was to convince them through deception that they were the "givers" of these gifts rather than the one been given the gifts. Therefore, they came to a belief that they were God, rather than serving God who has blessed them with the gifts.

Jesus' temptation in the desert is one of many scriptural passages that parallel the human condition. The weakness in temptation of Adam was humanity's fall from relationship with God. Jesus' strength to withhold giving in to temptation was God's action of restoring humanity's relationship with God. He faced temptation in the desert but remained faithful to his Father by emptying himself in love for the world rather than seeking personal gain at the expense of the world serving him.

When each of us faces the temptation to sin, we are deceived like Adam and Eve that all our words and actions reflect a belief that each of us IS God and we have nobody else to serve but our own self. Serving ourselves often comes with the price of hurting or alienating others. When we fall to temptation, Jesus came to restore that grace lost through disobedience. He now has compassion on us in our weakness and freely offers us forgiveness and strengthens us to grow stronger in his love. Jesus is the new Adam. His coming among us is the saving act that each of us now seek with hope.

When we grow stronger in his love and are obedient to his commands, we care for all that God has given us by loving and serving others in need.

May the beginning of this Lenten season open our hearts to that mercy and forgiveness of God, and may we continue to deepen our union with him and our brothers and sisters through acts of charity, sacrifice and prayer.


