CR CORNER



The gospel reading that is presented to us on this first Sunday of Lent is the temptations that Jesus faced when he was in the desert for forty days. When he heard the Father declare to him at his baptism: "you are my beloved Son in

whom I am well pleased," he found it important to find that quiet place to prayerfully ponder within himself what those words meant for him. He established within himself to call to be sent forth to establish and kingdom of justice, peace and love for all people through his own sacrificing love of suffering and death. The temptations that he would face from the devil would be to persuade him that "you are NOT the beloved of God. Being the beloved cannot involve saving and redeeming humanity through a self-giving gift of suffering and death but as God, you can have everything for your own good and your own sake and that will make you happy."

Sometimes it may be difficult for any of us to believe that Jesus was tempted to be led on this path because he was God and God did not sin. However, it was important for Jesus to be tempted in order to lead us to understand how the temptations for ourselves can lead us to a path of self-interest and self-indulgence and ultimately, can lead us from the path God has planned for us to be his instruments of God's saving love in the world.

We are invited to ponder in our own lives the truth that each of us is 'a beloved son or daughter of God' and that our call to union with God is to unite our sufferings to that of Jesus' suffering and to make sacrifices to cooperate with God in bringing his peace, justice and love to others. Whatever temptations we experience in our lives that lead us astray from that truth, calls us to seek the Spirit's strength to redirect our hearts back to doing God's will and drawing closer to him just as Jesus drew strength from the Father.
