CR CORNER



In today's Gospel (Luke 20:38) some Sadducees, those who say there is no resurrection, came to Jesus to ask him a question. Really, they wanted to test him to see if he himself believed in the resurrection of

the dead. The question of the seven brothers marrying the same woman is really a theoretical question meant to "trip up" Jesus and not to really get a response that would somehow inform them and perhaps change their minds in the resurrection.

It would be easy for us to sit comfortable in our own positions today and to judge the Sadducees as non-believer. How dare they deny the basic tenant on the faith that Jesus has the power to raise us up from the dead! The reality is that there are all sorts of ways that we today are like the Sadducees and deny the power of the Jesus' Resurrection to transform all things.

If we think the world "is going to hell in a handbasket" and becoming a more evil place, we are essentially denying the power of the Resurrection. If I don't believe that I can break my addiction to whatever to which I am addicted, then I am denying the power of the Resurrection. If we always see the glass half empty, we are denying the power of the Resurrection. If I don't think someone in my life can change, then I am denying the power of the Resurrection. If we have lost hope and are living in despair, we are denying the power of the Resurrection.

Fathers Dan and Toby and I are very proud to be members of the Congregation of the Resurrection, i.e., men of Hope in the transforming power of God's Love! Often when we gather for prayer we pray the Resurrection prayer! Please join us and pray:

Resurrection Prayer

O Risen Lord, the Way, the Truth, and the Life, make us faithful followers of the spirit of Your Resurrection.

Grant that we may be inwardly renewed, dying to ourselves in order that You may live in us. May our lives serve as signs of the transforming power of Your love.

Use us as Your instruments for the renewal of society, bringing Your life and love to all, and leading them to Your Church.

This we ask of You, Lord Jesus, living and reigning with the Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God forever. Amen.
