God Cannot Fill a Full Glass

As we enter into the final two Sundays of the liturgical season, the readings are full of death, letting go, and facing the unknown with faith in a God who has always provided. It is a time

for us to do an inventory of sorts as we look at our lives and ask what we are holding onto that keeps God from granting us even more. I like the image of a glass being filled by God with good things that fill our hearts with joy and gratitude. Eventually our lives fill up with these things that are meant to come and go. Yet we sometimes have a tendency to hang onto our favourites. The danger here is that a failure to let go can keep our glass full which keeps God from adding anything new. Have you ever tried filling a full glass? Impossible!

Letting go is so hard sometimes. It's a surrendering of sorts to the giver of all gifts and often leaves us feeling empty and alone. But if we move forward as brothers and sisters of one family, we are told that God will provide. If not through the stories in the scriptures we find evidence of God's generosity in the stories we share about bringing our emptiness to God and receiving more than we could hope for. Is your glass empty?

What is the Diocese of Hamilton?
