FROM SORROW TO JOY!

A little girl found the chrysalis of a butterfly and put it into a jar. One day a small opening appeared. She sat and watched the butterfly for several hours as it struggled to force its body through that little hole. Then it seemed to stop making any progress. It appeared as if it had gotten as far as it could and could go no further. So the girl decided to help the butterfly. She took a pair of scissors and snipped off the remaining bit of the chrysalis. The butterfly then emerged easily and flopped to the bottom of the jar. But it had a swollen body and small shriveled wings. The girl continued to watch the butterfly because she expected that, at any moment, the wings would enlarge and expand to be able to support the enlarged body. Neither happened! In fact, the butterfly crawled around the jar with a swollen body and shriveled wings before it soon died. It never was able to fly.


What the little girl in her kindness and haste did not understand was that the restricting chrysalis and the struggle required for the butterfly to get through the tiny opening were nature's way of forcing fluid from the body of the butterfly into its wings so that it would be ready for flight once it achieved its freedom from the chrysalis. Sometimes sorrows struggles are exactly what we need in our life before we can come to

freedom and joy. If we were allowed to go through our life without any sorrow or obstacles, it would cripple us. We would not be as strong as we could have been. And we would never know the joy of flying.
