Is it Time to Let Go?

"It's time to let go" is a phrase that often brings with it as certain sadness and reluctance. A realization that we must say goodbye to one thing to embrace another. Letting go is not easy

but that is precisely what Jesus is asking of the rich man in this Sunday's gospel. I doubt he knew at the time that choosing to keep his wealth would cause billions of people for centuries to come to ponder their own attachments to wealth. But it has. We continue to see ourselves in his place wondering what our answer would be. A "yes" means we let go of our possessions and trust in his promise for something we could never provide for ourselves. A "no" means that we stay attached to material things while maintaining a level of distraction that keeps us from facing our mortality. No easy response here. Yet why do some say "yes?" Perhaps they are reckless? Perhaps they are near the end of their lives and have grown tired of things that don't last? Perhaps they never had much to begin with? Or perhaps they have fallen in love. If this is the case then why can't love be our reason for letting go of a little more each day? Prayerfully reflecting on the same love with which Jesus asks the rich man to let go. Wondering if he loves us all that much and if his promises are true. In these moments we might just find a love that we yearn for more than wealth. Moments of letting go of our expiring securities so that we are vulnerable enough to rest in the arms of someone that delights in our company and walks with us on a journey that is forever new.


