CR CORNER



It is interesting that the readings this Sunday reveal a softer side of Jesus and ultimately God. One of comforter, companion, and healer. Our first reading reveals the comfort God wraps the 'the remnant of Israel' with in an

attempt to bring them back home after a time of wandering and suffering. Paul's letter to the Hebrews points out that it was providential that Christ lived in the limitations of weakness so that he might be a fit companion for those who may at times feel 'ignorant or uncertain.' And in the gospel reading from Mark we find Jesus healing a bind man's sight in a way that responded immediately to his direct and persistent request to see. Often times I hear God portrayed as an indestructible force that has come to rescue us from a place beyond our imaging. Swooping down to take us up there somewhere. What the readings reveal to me, and maybe to us all, this Sunday is that God can also be the opposite. A softer presence that is quite near, gentle, and vulnerable. A loving companion and healer. Desiring above all else to spend more time with us. Not so much concerned about how far we have strayed, but worried that we may have forgotten just how much we are loved, or become blind from seeing the goodness in us and in the world around us that we were meant to see.
