CR CORNER



The event of Christ's Paschal Mystery separates the two ways that the Son of God is present in the New Testament. The *Jesus of Nazareth* before the Resurrection and the *Risen Lord* after the Resurrection. Jesus of Nazareth is no longer present to us as he was present to his disciples before his Resurrection. However, he is now more present to us even 24/7 as the Risen Lord.

Since the Risen Lord is God's Son we sometimes forget that he is not only "God" but he was Jesus of Nazareth, who was fully human. We think that because he is fully God that he cannot in some way identify with our discouragement, pain, disappointment, suffering or diminishment. We somehow forget that Jesus of Nazareth who was both God and human was transformed by the Father into the Risen Lord. The humanity of Jesus of Nazareth is now mystically part of the divinity of the Risen Lord. Intricately linked forever is humanity and divinity in the Risen Lord.

Today's second reading from Hebrews makes this point: *"For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sin. Let us therefore approach the throne of grace with boldness, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need."* (Hebrews 4:14-15)

The call then is to approach him with "boldness", i.e., we can be sure that he will understand us and what we are going through because he himself shared and shares our human nature. In other word: "Jesus gets me!" I can come to him boldly with anything without fear or trepidation because he get me! When I do go to him, I will receive endless mercy and abundant grace for my time of need! Having experience such overwhelming generosity of mercy and grace from the Risen Lord, we are then called to be instruments of that mercy and grace to others as strive for the resurrection of society.
