CR CORNER



Today's Gospel, the parable of the "rich man and Lazarus" (Luke 16:19-31), warns us of the evils of total self-reliance and total self-absorption. Jesus tells the story in such a way that we are immediately set on our ear!

The first strange thing is that we do not know the name of the rich man but we do know the name of Lazarus. This is a total reversal of how we know the names of the rich but not of the nameless poor. Then, the dogs take more notice and have more compassion for Lazarus than a human being, the rich man, who must have turned a blind eye to Lazarus as he stepped over him daily as he walked through the gate. Daily scraps fell from the rich man's table that could have satisfied Lazarus but he was simply not interested in Lazarus.

Then, the stark contrast in their deaths with Lazarus being carried up to heaven with angels and the rich man simply being buried, period. Finally in Hades, the rich man finally notices Lazarus and wants to make him his servant by having Lazarus bring him water. He still does not get it! He is so self-absorbed! Then he wants to turn Lazarus into his messenger for his brothers. Wow, the self-absorptions is gigantic!

To make matters worse the rich man even turns on Father Abraham and talks back to him in a disrespectful manor. Double Wow, the egocentrism is absolute! Jesus is trying to help us to understand that our present day life choices have a direct impact upon our life after death. God did not condemn the rich man to Hades, he was already in a Hades by his choice to be so egocentric. After death, God respects his choice and allows him to stay in his self-chosen self-absorption, i.e., to stay in Hades.

Being made in God's image and likeness we are "wired" to be relational and to care about and love one another. Our ability to love brings us from turning inward upon ourselves and moves us out to the other in kindness, mercy, and compassion. This Gospel is a wakeup call for us to examine the ways we have chosen to be like the rich man and to repent and turn from those death dealing ways before it's too late!
