CR CORNER

(A weekly reflection from one or all of the Resurrectionists here at St. Mary's)

In today's first reading from Numbers Joshua asked Moses to stop Eldad and Medad who were prophesying in the camp. Moses replied: "Would that all the Lord's people were Prophets, and that the Lord would put his spirit on them." Similarly, in today's Gospel from Mark, John told Jesus that they saw someone casting out demons in the Lord's name, and we tried to stop him, because he was not following us. Like Moses, Jesus responded by saying: "Do not stop him; for no one who does a deed of power in my name will be able soon afterward to speak evil of me. Whoever is not against us is for us."

We often create "in" groups and "out" groups in our minds, our homes, or families, our neighbourhoods, or faith communities and in our world. Those who belong are like us, look like us, talk like us, act like us, and think like us. Those who are excluded simply don't "fit in". One of the greatest titles of the Holy Father is *Pontifex Maximus*, i.e., the ultimate bridge builder. As followers of Jesus we are called to build bridges and not walls. We are called to develop communities with outstretched arms to all our all of our neighbours. For when we fail to offer welcome and hospitality to the orphan, widow and the outcast we fail to open our arms to Jesus himself.
