FREEDOM OF CONSCIENCE FOR PHYSICIANS AND SURGEONS: Deadline for concerns due Feb. 20th

CPSO has announced that a revised draft policy has now been approved, with the new title "Professional Obligations and Human Rights." The College is seeking input from the public prior to final approval of their policy.

This revised draft raises serious ethical concerns about a physician's freedom of conscience. The policy would no longer protect physicians who refuse to make a referral if it violates their own conscience, when for example, matters such as abortion, reproduction and end-of-life care are involved.

Bishop Fabbro encourages us to read the draft policy found on our information desk and make your concerns known to CPSO.
