St. Michael's Cathedral Basilica

The Archdiocese of Toronto celebrates the feast day of our archdiocesan patron, St. Michael. All are welcome to join in a special celebration. Archbishop Francis Leo will celebrate Mass, with music from the world-renowned St. Michael's Choir School. As part of the celebration, the Apostolic Nuncio to Canada, the Most Rev. Ivan Jurkovič, will confer the pallium on our archbishop, a symbol of his role as Metropolitan Archbishop of Toronto and shepherd to the faithful. Following Mass, there will be an informal reception with light refreshments in the St. Michael's Cathedral atrium and courtyard. Seating will be first come, first served. All are welcome to join in this special celebration for our archdiocese and archbishop!

WHAT IS A PALLIUM?



A pallium, liturgical vestment worn over the chasuble by the pope, archbishops, and some bishops. It is bestowed by the pope on archbishops and bishops having metropolitan jurisdiction as a symbol of their participation in papal authority. It is

made of a circular strip of white lamb's wool about two inches wide and is placed over the shoulders. Two vertical bands, extending from the circular strip in the front and back, give the pallium a Y-shaped appearance. Six crosses, one each on the chest and back and on each shoulder and band, adorn the vestment.

The pallia are made of wool from lambs that are presented on the feast of St. Agnes of Rome (January 21), whose name became associated with the Latin word for lamb *(agnus)*. Two lambs are traditionally blessed by the pope on that day and then on Holy Thursday the sheep's wool is sheared.

Trivia – St Vincent de Paul's Life and Times

St Vincent de Paul died on September 27, 1660 in Paris. For over forty years, starting in 1617, he had preached missions in the rural parts of France. From this priestly work and the need for more priests, a new Society of Apostolic Life emerged, the Vincentians or the Lazarists. Their initials are C.M. because of their official title: the Congregation of the Missions. Inspired by St Philip Neri's Oratorians, St Vincent de Paul did not want his Congregation to take vows. They would live and work for the glory of God bound by divine love. By God's providence, the first Mass in the new St Vincent de Paul parish was celebrated on September 27, 1914. *Where?* At 231 Roncesvalles Ave, in a storefront that Fr Minehan had rented before building our church!
