A NOTE ABOUT MASS INTENTIONS

What does it mean to have a Mass offered for a specific intention? An individual may ask a priest to offer a Mass for several reasons: for example, in thanksgiving, for the intentions of another person (such as on a birthday), or, as is most common, for the repose of the soul of someone who has died. Usually, a stipend is given to the priest for offering the Mass, which thereby in justice creates an obligation which must be satisfied. The tradition of offering Masses for

others, particularly the dead, originates in the very early Church. When we face the death of someone, even a person who is not Catholic, to have a Mass offered for the repose of his soul and to offer our prayers are more beneficial and comforting than any other sympathy card or bouquet of flowers. To have a Mass offered on the occasion of a birthday, anniversary or special need is appropriate, beneficial and appreciated. One must never forget the infinite graces that flow from the Sacrifice of the Mass which benefit one's soul.

WORLD YOUTH DAY, 2011

Planted and Built Up in Jesus Christ, Firm in the Faith. (Col 2:7)

Have you been wondering about how our World Youth Day pilgrims are doing? Here are some messages sent from Fr. Martin in Spain. Please continue to keep the pilgrims in your prayers.

August 11 - Another very good day today. We had Mass in Burgos Cathedral at 9:30. Then a whirlwind tour of the place because we wanted to get to Monasterio de las Huelgas before it closed. There we had a more leisurely tour with an English speaking guide. The youth were very interested in what they saw. A picnic lunch along the way -- came to less than 3 Euros per person. Arrived in our two towns (where we are being hosted). We in Sanguesa were given a warm reception.

August 12 - People in both towns are very happy with the accommodations and the activities. The day started with Mass in each town, followed by breakfast, and a tour of the towns. Biggish lunch, especially for those who are posted to families. Then there was a two hour walk on the Camino. (I opted for a siesta.) At 7 the pilgrims all came to Sanguesa where a local theater company put on a play about Sanguesa's origin as an important Compostelan support town and its association with San Francis Xavier. We then walked to a park on the Aragon River and had a big dinner. Then we rushed back to the Capuchin church where our actors did themselves proud (performing their play about the Canadian Martyrs.) There were about 250 people in the audience and they gave them a standing ovation. A local photographer with a big digital camera took many pictures and will be sending them to me. The weather has been hot and fairly humid although a breeze makes it bearable.

August 13 - A full day at Javier Castle (the birthplace of St. Francis Xavier). All except for me walked 7 km to get to the Castle. We had a big concelebrated Mass with the Archbishop of Pamplona, Francisco Perez. We (or at least some of us) met the OCY (The Office of Catholic Youth from Toronto) pilgrimage. Bishop McGrattan was there and was very friendly to us. All are in good spirits as far as I can tell and those who are staying with host families are especially thrilled with their accommodations. . . Today we had paella for lunch. The kids liked the "chicken" but some of them liked it less when I pointed out that it was rabbit, the traditional paella ingredient.

August 14 - All is well. A walking tour of Pamplona and then Roncesvalles. Then we split up again to our respective towns. Tomorrow we go to Pamplona for a Mass of the Assumption and then off to Alcala de Henares. Hasta pronto!




